The role

We're looking for the right person to join our Compass team from September, developing some of the most innovative alternative curriculum work in the UK.

The Compass team work intensively with 13-19 year olds from local High Schools. The team's aim is to help young people be successful in their education and to enter further education, training or employment once they leave school. We believe that emotional and social well-being plays a crucial part in enabling this to happen. As part of the Compass team, you'll work intensively with groups of students to enable them to overcome their barriers to learning.

The Compass team often use sport and media as tools in their work. You'll have responsibility for creating and leading some of the input, as well as a chance to contribute to the Compass Project's strategy. You'll work Professionally alongside schools and other providers to enable young people to get the most out of the project. You'll deliver accredited courses as well as innovative new material. This role is dynamic and involves working with an exciting mix of young people.

Package

We offer a starting salary of up to 23k, depending on qualifications and experience. Help with relocating to Bedfordshire is also available.

LCET encourage ongoing training and development, including the opportunity to study for a relevant Degree or Masters as part of your work (funded by LCET) after the first year of working with us.
